If you have never exhibited at a flower and produce show before you might find the following hints and tips helpful.

- 1 READ the schedule; if the class asks for 6 Runner Beans make sure you show 6, and 6 only.
- 2 When a class asks for more than one item then the judge will generally be looking for consistency in size, colour and shape.
- 3 Vegetables should be shown at their optimum size and ripeness for eating or cooking; bigger does not always mean better, unless of course it is Class 2 (longest) or 17 (biggest).
- 4 When harvesting fruit or vegetables, take care not to break off the stalks and handle / transport carefully to avoid bruising.
- 5 The fresher the better but allow time for washing, mud does not win prizes! The only exception to this rule is onions / garlic which require time to dry.
- 6 Entries in the preserve classes should be labelled with the date of making and main ingredients. Make sure your label does not give away your identity! For food safety all preserves should have an airtight seal using new or at least clean lids and any vinegar based products should have a plastic lined lid.
- 7 As any exhibit in the Produce Section may be sampled please ensure that they are food safe and fit for human consumption!
- 8 Allow plenty of time for staging your exhibits at the Hall.
You WILL be asked to leave at 12pm!
- 9 Although every care will be taken to safeguard exhibits, the Show will not be held responsible for any loss or damage.

- 3 FRENCH BEANS: 6, each complete with stalk & tail
- 4 BEETROOT: 3, with tops trimmed to 5cm, roots uncut
- 5 CARROTS: 3, with tops trimmed to 5cm, roots uncut
- 6 CUCUMBER: 1, your best
- 7 COURGETTES: 2, best pair
- 8 LEEKS: 3, with tops trimmed but roots uncut
- 9 RED ONIONS: 3, with tops trimmed and folded
- 10 ONIONS: 3, with tops trimmed and folded
- 11 POTATOES: 5, of any one variety
- 12 GARLIC: 2 whole heads
- 13 TOMATOES: 4, non cherry type
- 14 CHERRY TOMATOES: 8 ripe fruit
- 15 CHILLIES or PEPPERS: 3, of any one variety
- 16 HERBS: cut stems of as many varieties as you grow
- 17 HEAVIEST VEGETABLE: Class may be split into types if sufficient entries
- 18 ANY OTHER VEGETABLE: 2, of any one variety
- 19 COMIC OR JUST PLAIN UGLY! Vegetable or fruit
- 20 COOKING APPLES: 4, of any one variety
- 21 EATING APPLES: 4, of any one variety
- 23 PLUMS, DAMSONS OR GREENGAGES: 4, of any one variety
- 23 PEARS: 4, of any one variety
- 24 SOFT FRUIT: 10 of any one variety
- 25 ANY OTHER FRUIT: 4, of any one variety

- 32 NO FLOWERS: foliage, grasses and seedheads only
- 33 MINIATURE ARRANGEMENT
- 34 DINNER TABLE CENTREPIECE
- 35 ANNIVERSARY BOUQUET: traditionally 15 years is celebrated with red
- 36 GLADIOLI: a single stem
- 37 HOUSEPLANT: any variety, potted
